COUNTY CLERK.

The Commissioners of Hood River County, Oregon ordain as follows;

This Ordinance shall be known as the PUBLIC LAND CORNER PRESERVATION ORDINANCE and may be so pleaded and referred to.

Section II. Purpose.

Chapter 582, Section 5 of the 1985 Oregon Laws and Chapter 469 of the 1987 Oregon Laws have authorized the creation of a Public Land Corner Preservation Fund. Chapter 582 authorizes the use of funds from this account for the establishment, re-establishment and maintenance of all corners created by government surveys. Chapter 582 further provides for the creation of a \$10.00 user fee to be collected at the time of recording certain instruments pursuant to ORS 205.130. The County Board recognizes this fund to be a great public benefit, with several thousand government corners in Hood River County needing to be established, re-established and maintained.

Section III. Definitions.

3.1 Government Corners: Includes all corners and boundary lines as accepted in the U.S. Department of Interior (Bureau of Land Management)

Manual of Surveying Instructions and its supplements, such as section,

quarter section, donation land claim, meander, closing, witness, State

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- a. Corner: A point determined by the surveying process.
- b. Monument: The object or the physical structure which marks the corner point.
- c. Existent Corner: One whose position can be identified by verifying the evidence of the monument or its accessories, by reference to the description in the field notes, or located by an accepted supplemental survey record, some physical evidence, or testimony.
- d. Obliterated Corner: One at whose point there are no remaining traces of the monument, or its accessories, but whose location has been perpetuated, or the point for which may be recovered beyond reasonable doubt by the acts and testimony of the interested landowners, competent surveyors, other qualified local authorities, or witnesses, or by some acceptable record evidence.
- e. Lost Corner: A point of a survey whose position cannot be determined beyond reasonable doubt, either from traces of the original marks or from acceptable evidence or testimony that bears upon the original position, and whose location can be restored only by reference to one or more interdependent corners.
- f. County Surveyor: The Hood River County Serveyor or his designee.

 Section IV. Fees.
- 4.1 The Hood River County Clerk shall collect pursuant to ORS 205.130 and ORS 205.320, in addition to any other fees, a fee of \$10.00 for and upon the recording of:
 - (a) Deeds and mortgages of real property, powers of attorney

and contracts affecting the title to real property, authorized by law to be recorded, assignments thereof and of any interest therein when properly acknowledged or proved;

- (b) Certificates of sale of real property under execution or order of court, or assignments thereof or of any interest therein when properly acknowledged or proved; and
- (c) Certified copies of death certificates of any person appearing in the county records as owning or having a claim or interest in land in the county.
- 4.2 All monies collected under 4.1 above shall be deposited at least once a month with the County Department of Budget and Finance to be credited to the Public Land Corner Preservation Fund.

Section V. Establishment of Fund, Use of Funds.

- 5.1 Pursuant to Chapter 582 the Hood River County Treasurer shall establish a fund within the Hood River County General Fund to be known as the Public Land Corner Preservation Fund.
- 5.2 Monies in the Public Land Corner Preservation Fund shall be used only to pay expenses incurred or authorized by the County Surveyor in the establishment, re-establishment and maintenance of corners of government surveys under ORS 209.070 (5) and (6).

Section VI. Conformity with Law.

Ordinance

This Ordinance shell not in any way be a substitute for, nor eliminate the necessity for conformity with any and all laws superseding rules of the State of Oregon or its agencies, or any superseding ordinance, rule or regulation of Hood River County, Oregon.

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Section VII. Separability.

If any Section, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or its application to any statute, is determined by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, such determination shall not effect the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance or its application to any other statutes, but shall continue in effect.

Section VIII. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty days after the signing hereof.
