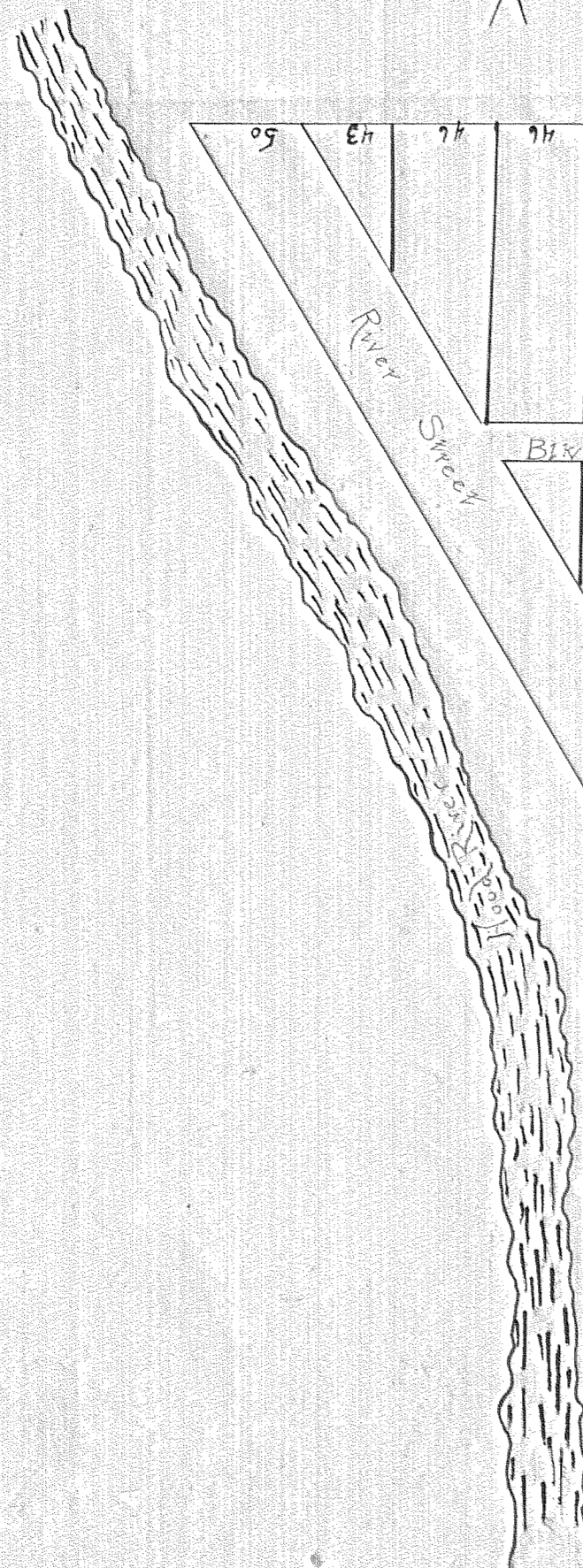

Know all men by these presents, That we, Wilson R. Winans and Mary Winans, husband and wife, of Wasco county, Oregon, owners under U.S. Land Laws of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. (1) One Township One (1) North and of range nine (9) East Willamette Meridian, do hereby declare the attached map to be the record map of the town of Winans Wasco county, Oregon, said map having as its initial point the SE corner of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of section one (1) of township One (1) North of range Nine (9) East Willamette Meridian, said townsite comprising a portion of the said Southeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Northeast quarter of section one (1) of township one (1) North of range Nine (9) East Willamette Meridian, as designated more particularly by the map, hereby dedicating to the use of the public all streets, alleys, avenues and public highways as set forth herein reserving the right of way for any and all railroads, telegraph, telephone and electric light lines, flumes, aqueducts, irrigating ditches, waterpipes.
